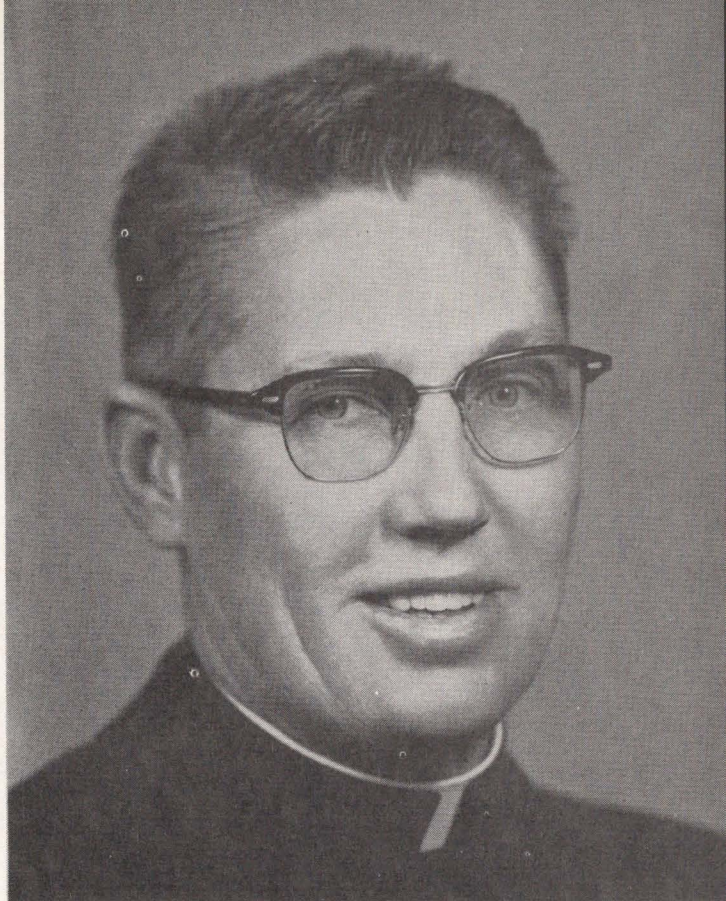

Father Ernest Hyman, C.M.F.

After Father Hyman was ordained on May 8, 1943 at the Old Plaza Church, he was assigned to Dominguez Seminary. After being Assistant Prefect and professor here, he did parish assignments in Texas and New Jersey. Appointed Prefect in 1951, he proved himself so desirable that he occupied the Prefect's post for nine consecutive years.

He is presently Financial Minister and professor at the college department in Calabasas, California.

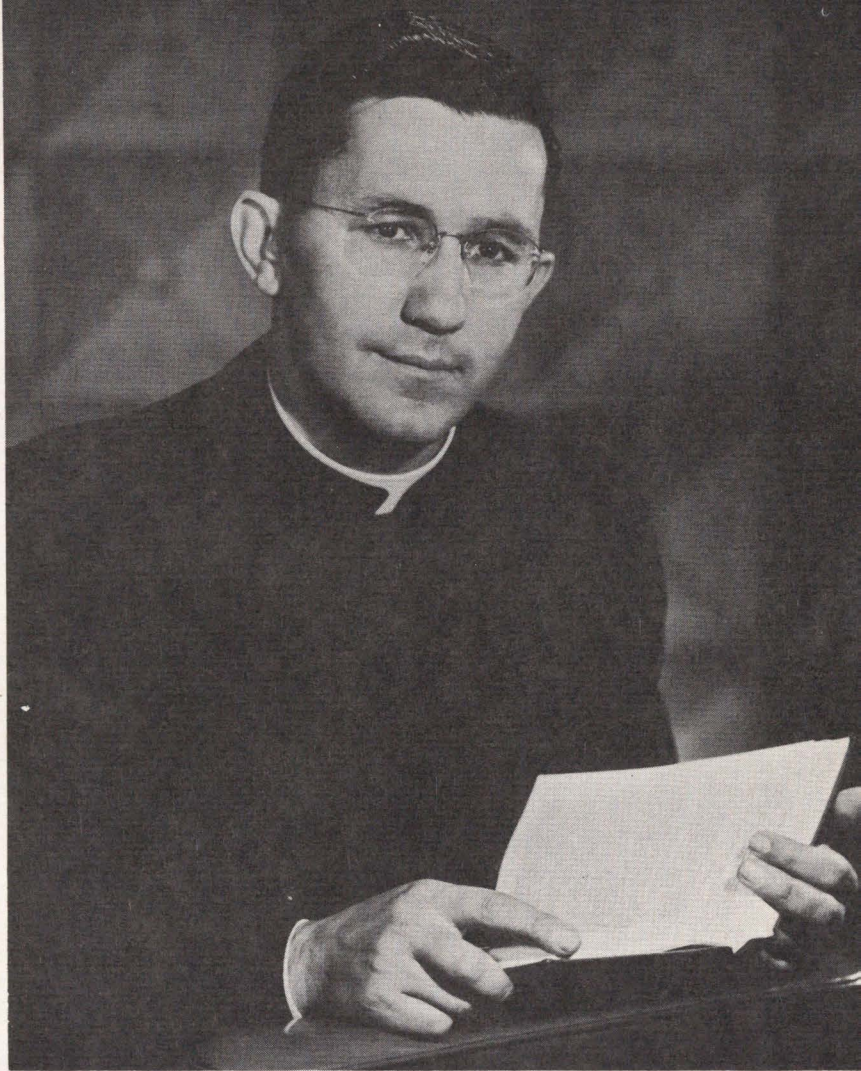

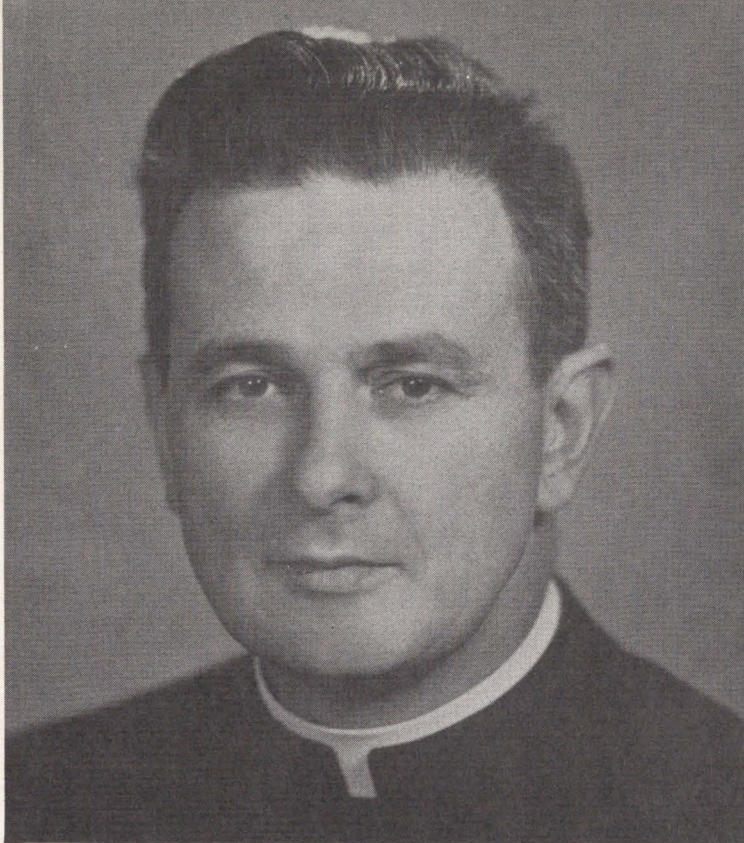
## *Father Provincial*

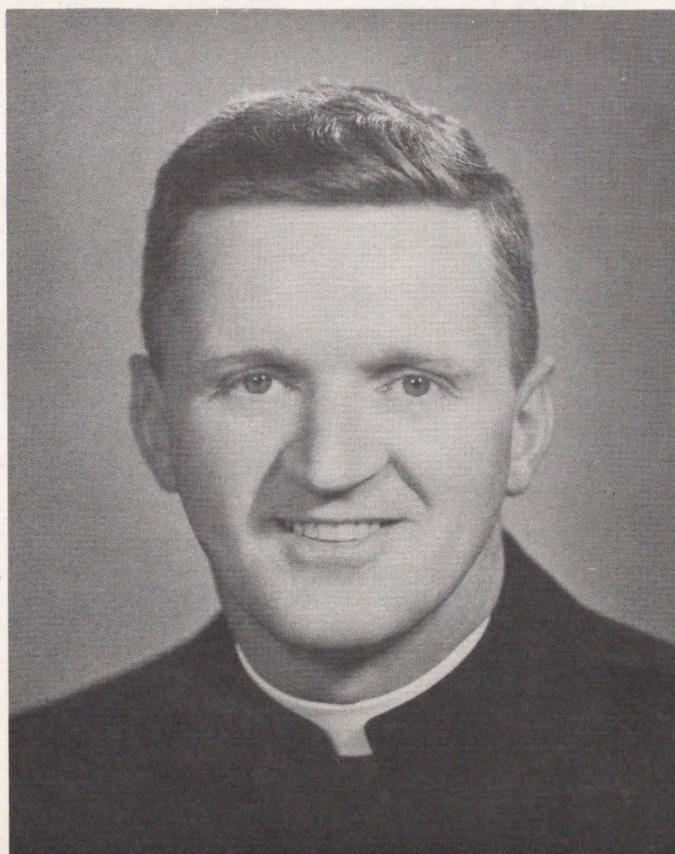
FATHER ANTHONY TOMICICH, C.M.F.

FATHER JAMES GRIFFIN, C.M.F.

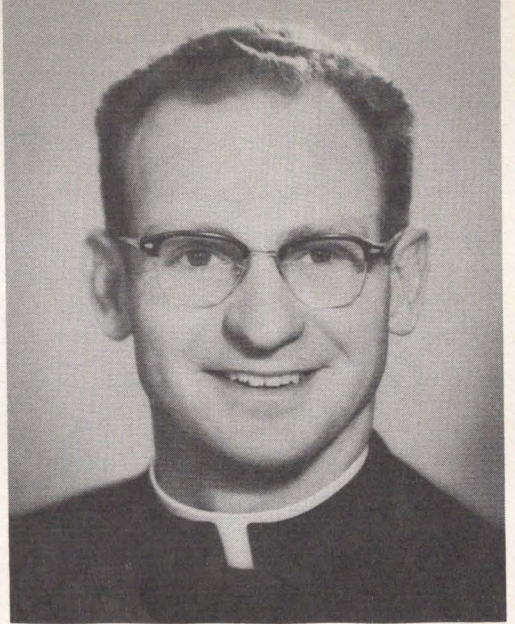

FATHER JOHN FESSLER, C.M.F.

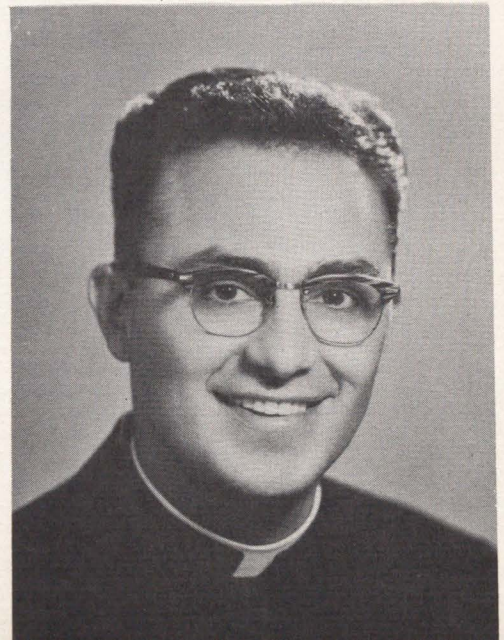

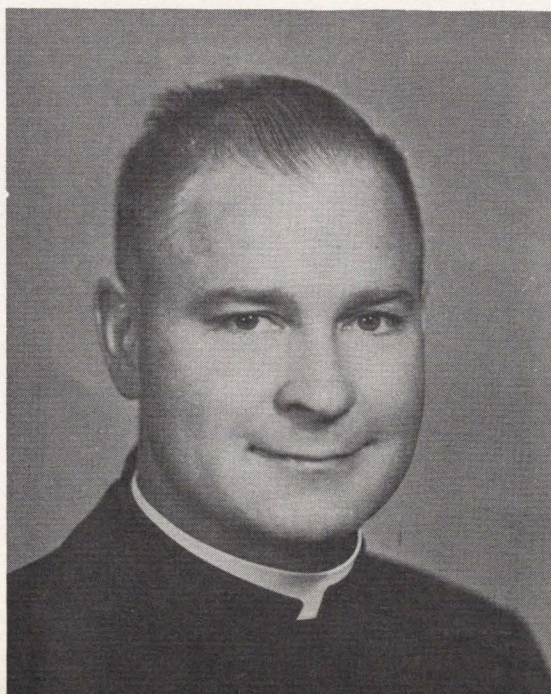


Father Leo Delgado, C.M.F

REV. EDWARD J. WIDMER, C.M.F.

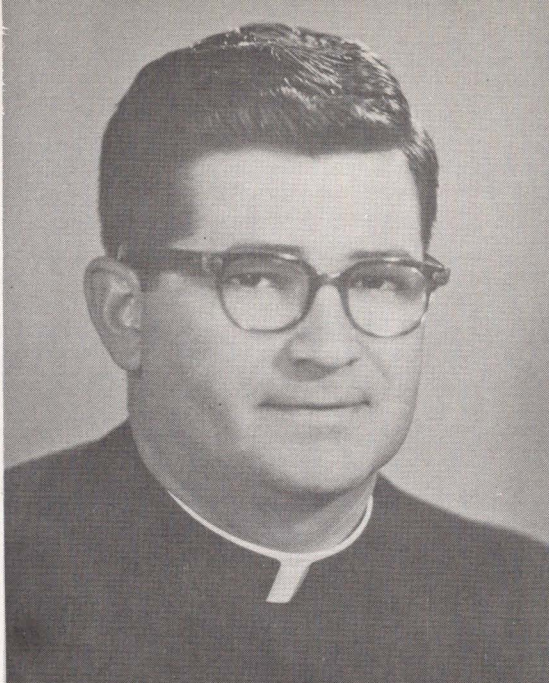

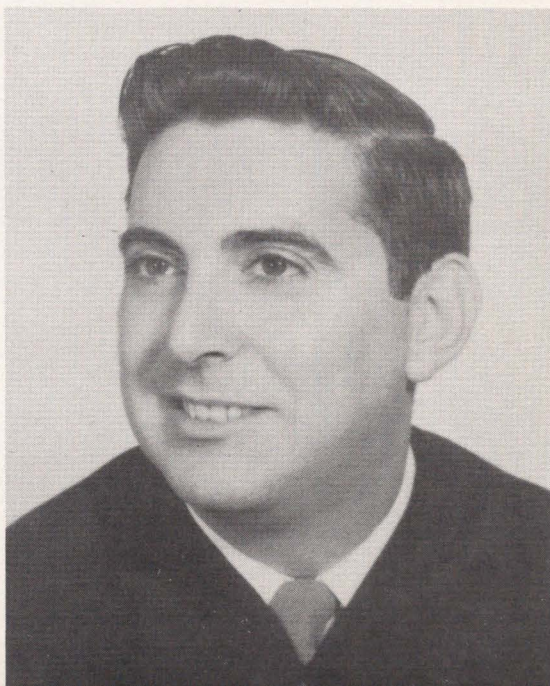

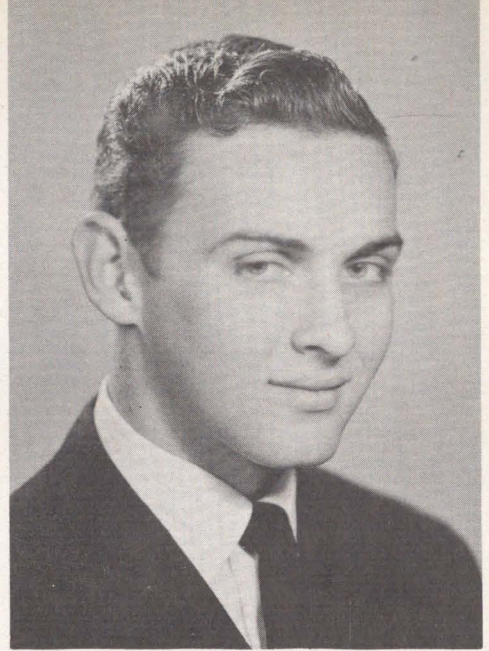
SACRED HEART, WEST COVINA

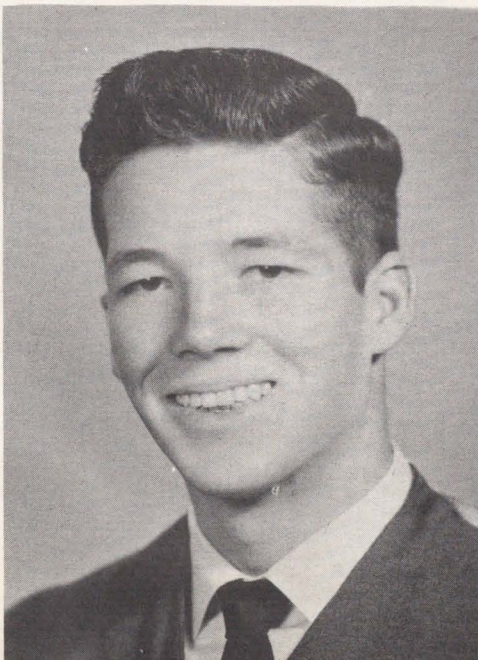
Ralph's favorite subjects are Latin, Physics, and English. He has been on the honor roll for his second, third, and fourth years.

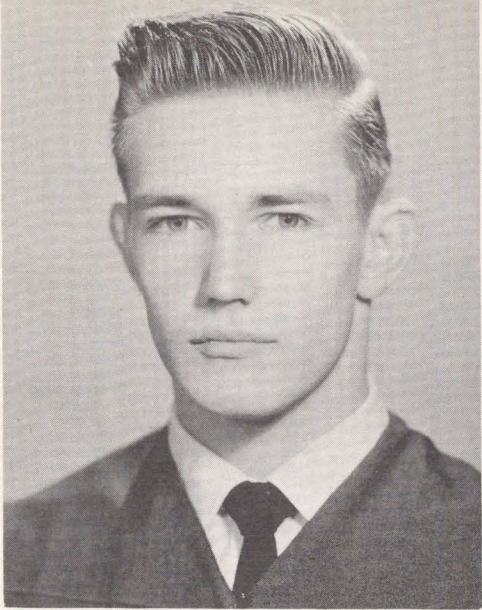
ST. JUSTIN'S, ANAHEIM

### Richard Gray, C.M.P.

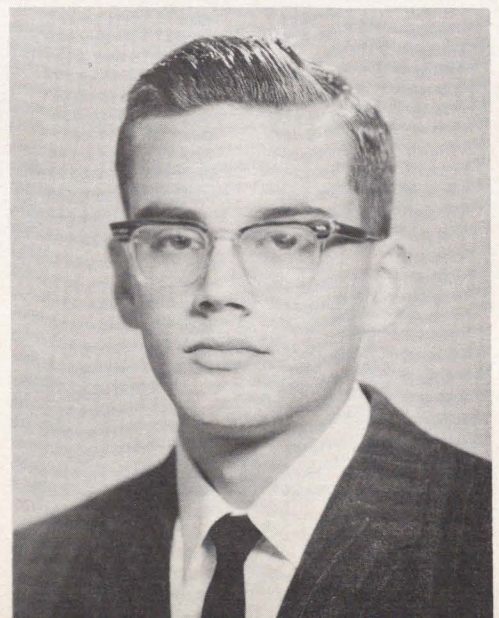
#### ST. JOSEPH'S, POMONA

Richard was born in Camarillo, California. He received his elementary education from Saint Joseph's in Pomona, California. He answered God's call to the religious life in 1957.

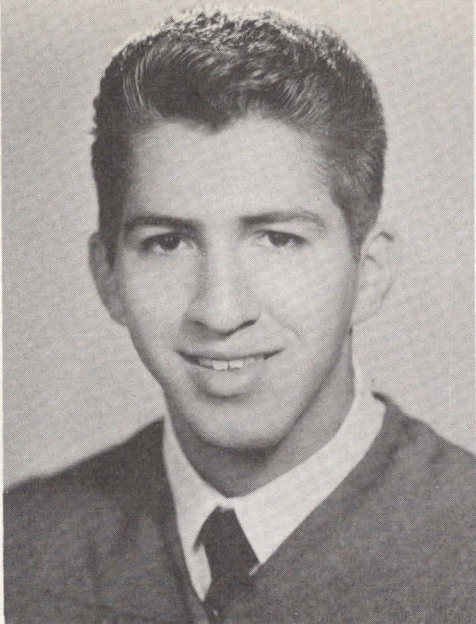
On the top of Richard's list of favorite subjects is English. Outside the scope of studies, he likes to participate in sports with action and excitement—baseball and soccer.

Richard will be remembered for his amicable service in the seminary tailor shop. His desire is to become a Brother and we know that the Congregation has a valuable member in him.





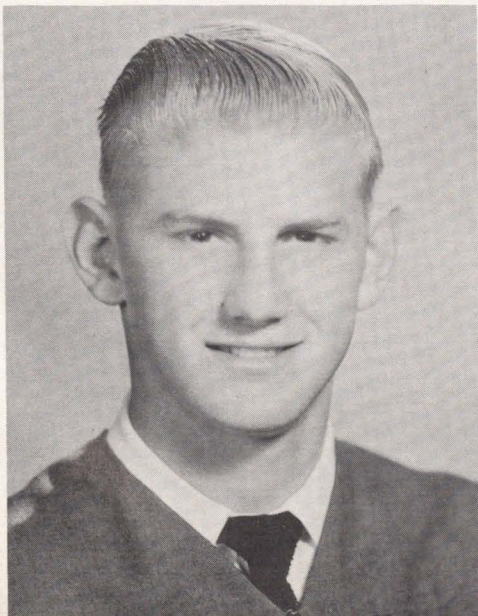


### Gonzalo Martinez, C.M.P.

#### IMMACULATE CONCEPTION, MONROVIA

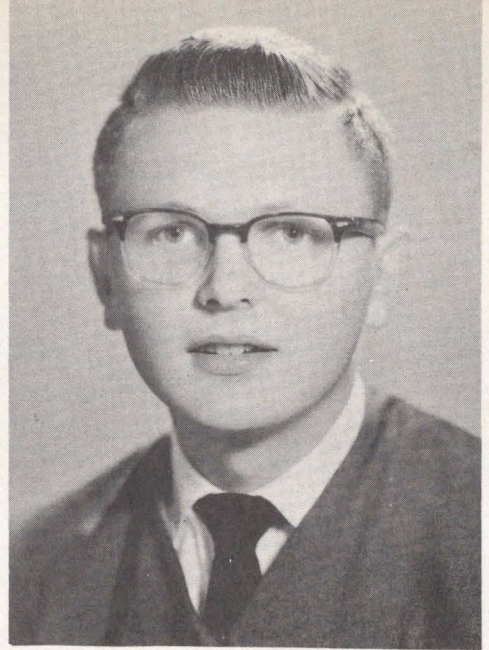

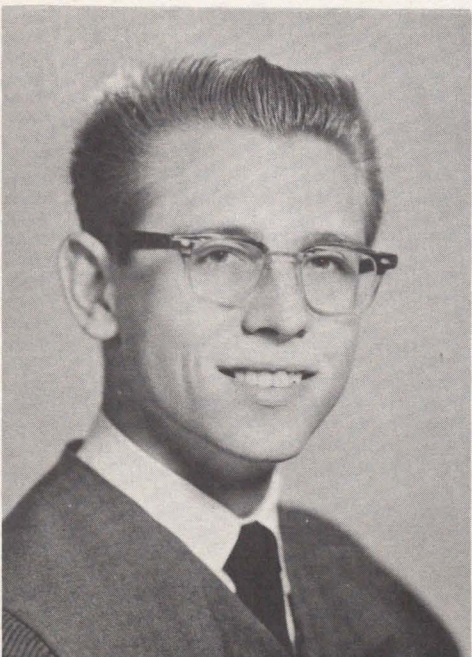
Nicholas Majersky, C.M.P.

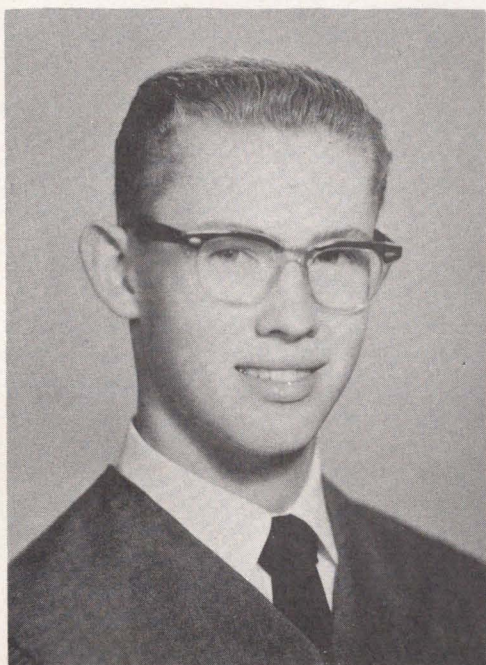
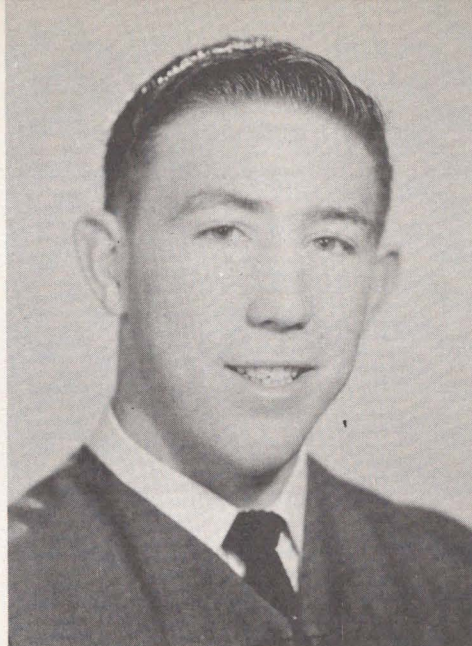




Stephen Sherwood, C.M.F.

Jim will be remembered as one of the most understanding infirmarians the seminary has ever had.

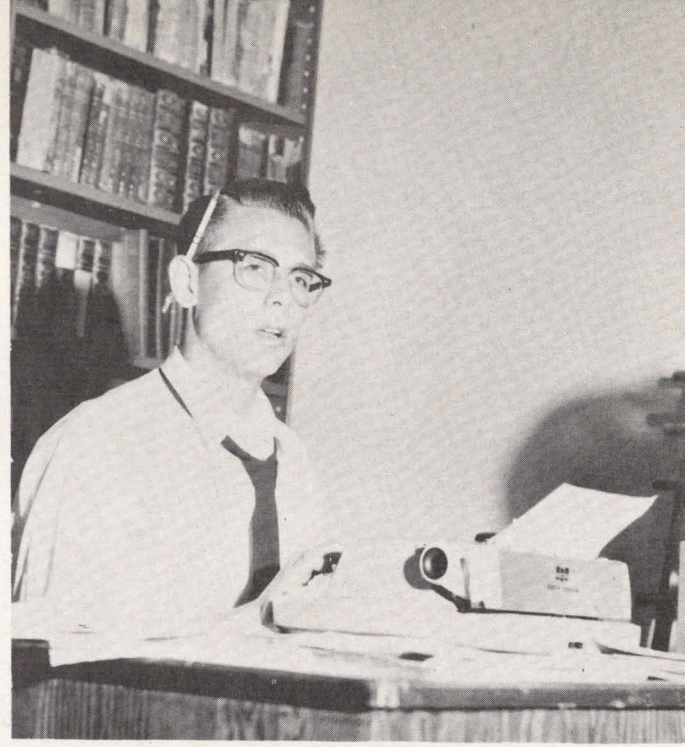
