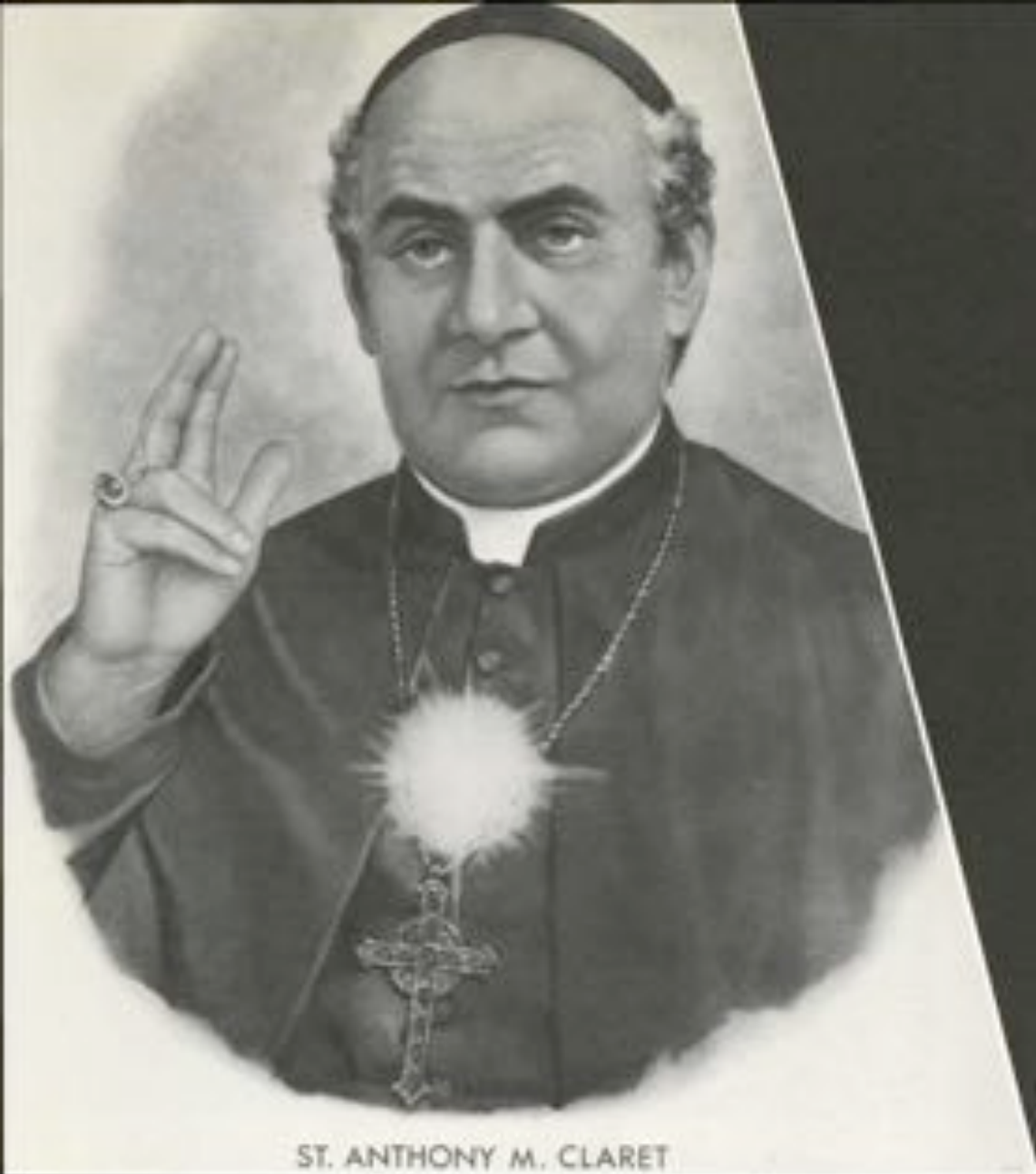

VERY REVEREND FATHER PETER SCHWEIGER, C.M.F.

Father Schweiger was born in Delsdorf, Germany on May 6, 1894 and made his first vows on August 15, 1912. After ordination to the priesthood on May 29, 1920 he was transferred to Rome where he obtained a doctor's degree in canon and civil law. He later distinguished himself as professor of canon law at San Anselmo. Previous to his first election as Superior General he was Provincial Superior of the German province. Father was reelected Superior General for a second term on May 10, 1951.



VERY REVEREND MICHAEL CECERE, C.M.F.

Father Cecere was born on February 8, 1929 in Castellaccio del Sauri, Italy. His family sojourned to Rhode Island and later came to Los Angeles. Father made his Perpetual Profession on February 8, 1941 and was ordained a priest on May 8, 1943. Father was elected Provincial Superior in 1959.



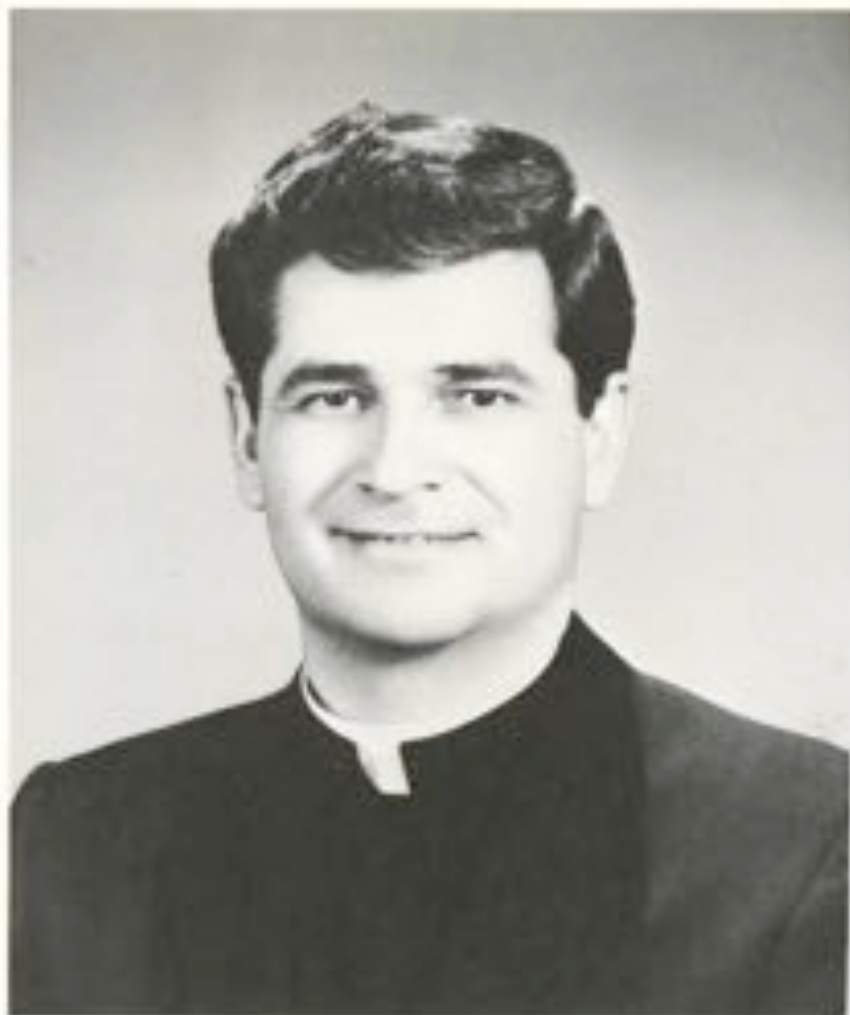

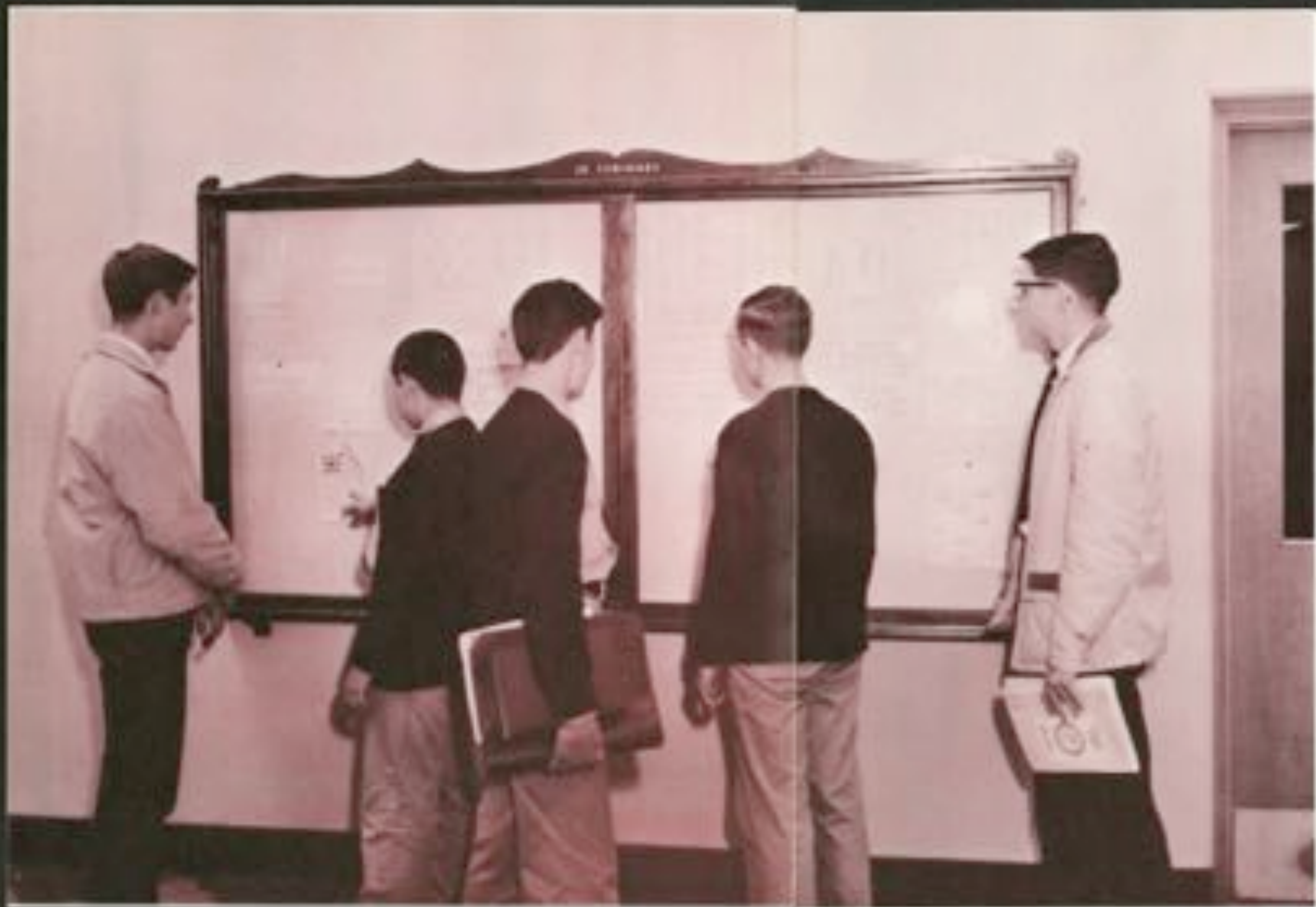
