







VERY REVEREND FATHER PETER SCHWEIGER, C.M.F.



REV. LEO MATTECHECK, C.M.F.






REV. FERMIN URRUTIA, C.M.F.


BRO, PAUL ROY, C.M.F.


Sabino, with natural leadership and very good conduct, has been Class President all four years and has done a good job for his classmates.






Study-wise, he has a preference for Greek and Physics. He seems to be athletically inclined and has proven his ability in both football and soccer.
