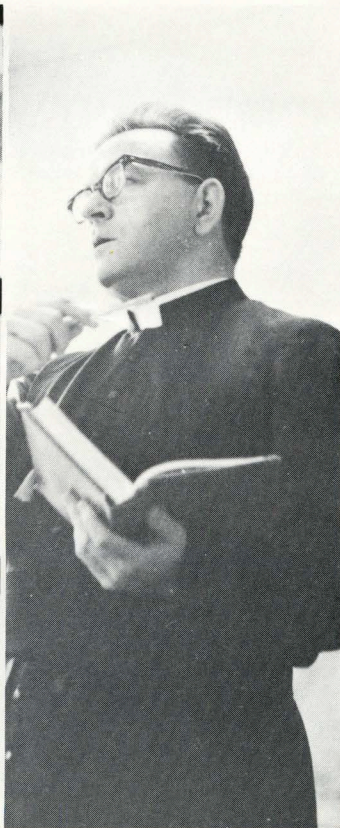
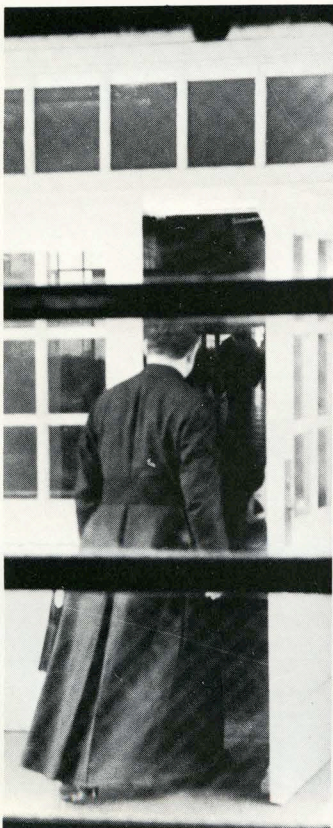


# DEDICATION

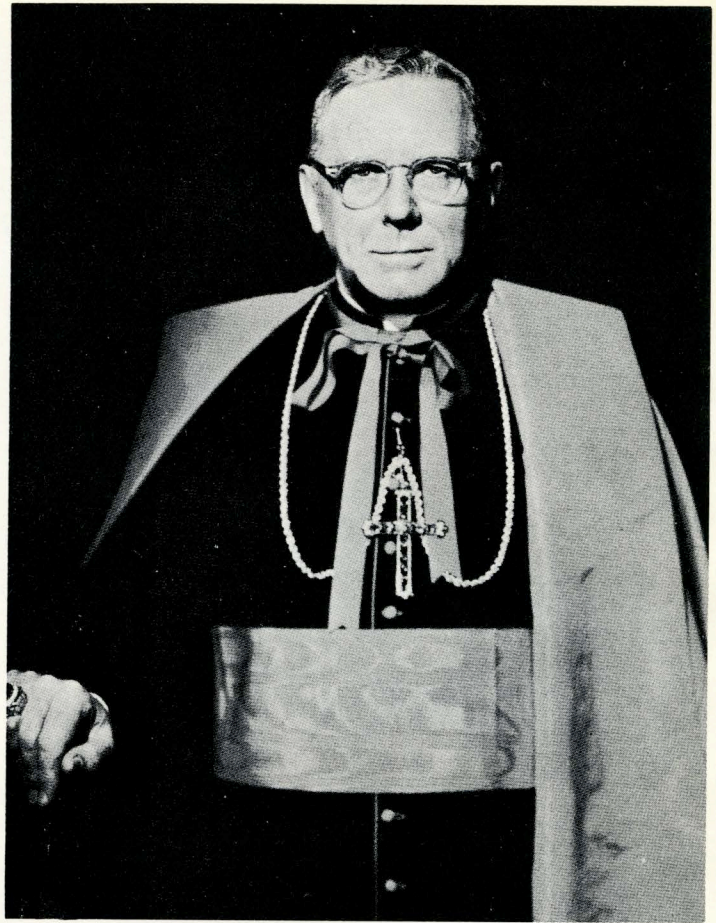
