The future looks good for this club, with more "unproved" and efficient methods in store.

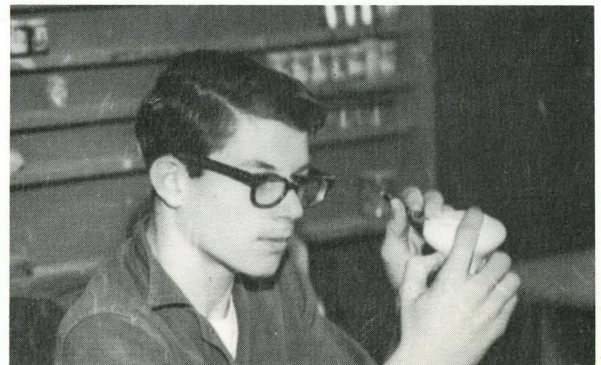

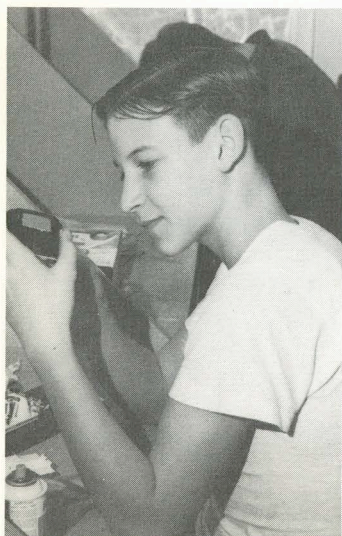
Hobby Club . . .

Under the able leadership of Brother Richard and Editor Tom Yeseta school activities were amply covered and student interests were well represented.



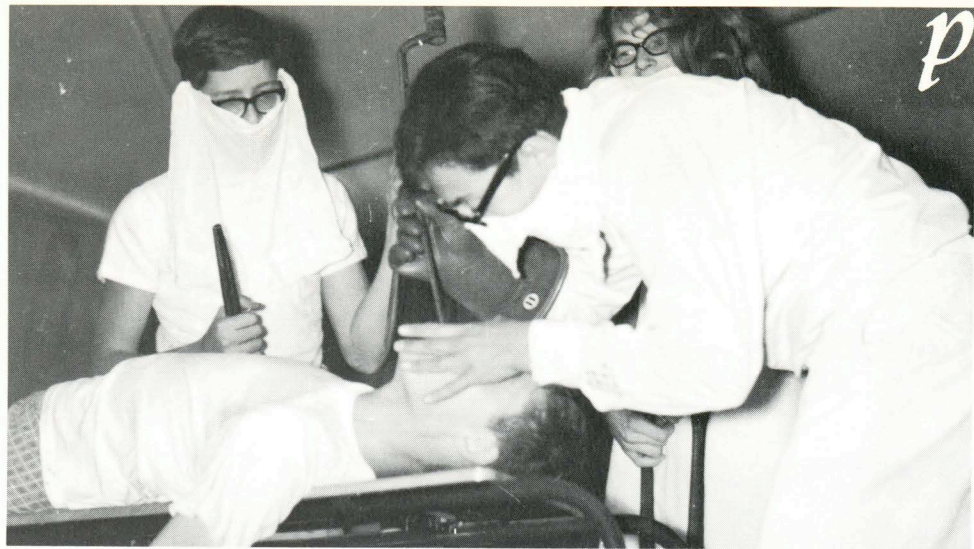

Varsity Basketball

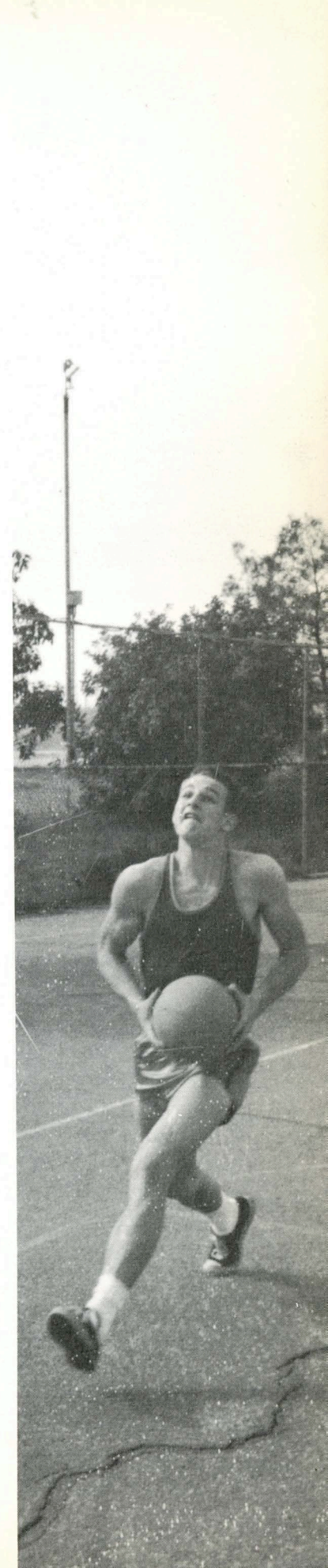


After strenuous practice, the varsity basketball team was all fired up and raring to go.

The only problem was there was no place to go. Our guess is that the other teams heard what tigers the basketball team was and chickened out.

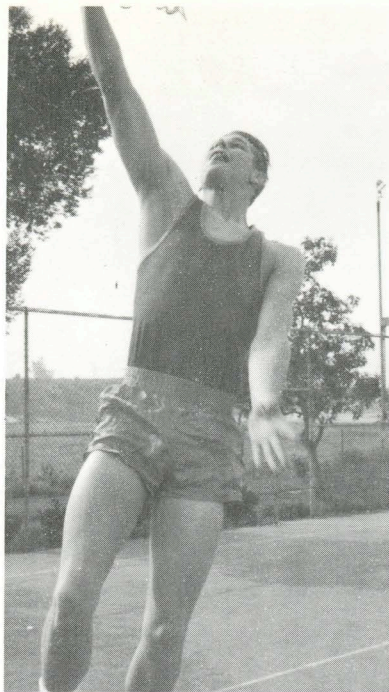
Well balanced with height, speed and coordination, the Dons managed to score an average fifty points per game. High point man was Ronnie Rodarte, who scored twenty points per game.

Since most of the players will be returning next year, Don basketball looks bigger and better than ever.

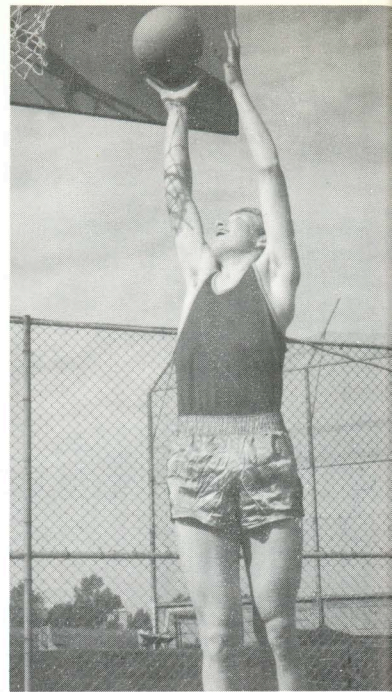
